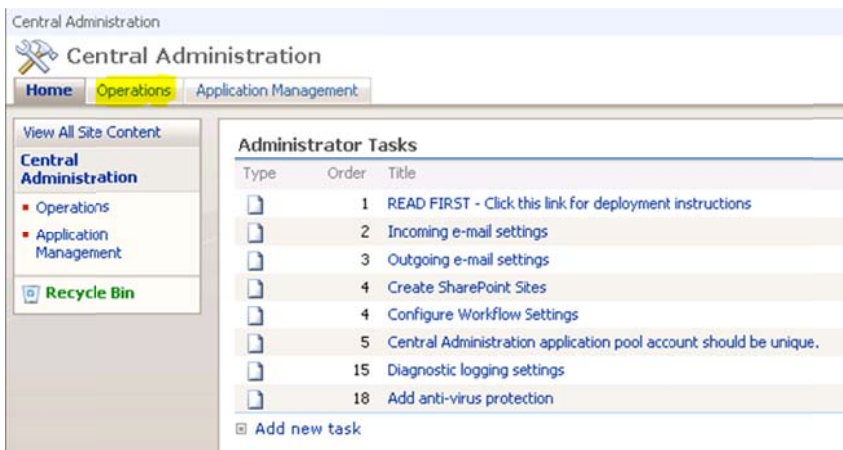


Install Ezidoesit solution

1. Copy the Ezidoesit SharePoint Solution to a local directory on the SharePoint Server.
2. Open a command prompt and enter the following commands (Note that the second command assumes you have copied the solution in step 1 to C:\Temp\Ezidoesit SharePoint Solution):
 - a. `cd "\Program Files\Common Files\Microsoft Shared\web server extensions\12\BIN"`
 - b. `Stsadm.exe -o addsolution -filename "C:\Temp\Ezidoesit SharePoint Solution\EzidoesitSharePointSolution.wsp"`

Note: pasting directly into the command window can contain invalid encoding. This can result in a "Command Line Error message. If this occurs, type in the command string.

3. Open SharePoint 3.0 Central Administration from the Administrative tools option in the start menu
4. Log in as the local administrator
5. Select Operations from the tabs along the top:



6. Select Solution Management from the Global Configuration section
7. Click on ezidoesitsharepointsolution.wsp

8. Click Deploy Solution

10. Click OK


Switch on Session State

1. Open C:\inetpub\wwwroot\wss\VirtualDirectories\80\web.config in notepad
2. Find the line `<add name="Session" type="System.Web.SessionState.SessionStateModule"/>`
3. Ensure that it is uncommented. If the value is:


```
<!-- <add name="Session" type="System.Web.SessionState.SessionStateModule"/> -->
```
4. Replace it with `<add name="Session" type="System.Web.SessionState.SessionStateModule"/>`
5. Save the web.config file.

Set up Ezidoesit Web Parts

1. Open the default site in IE (<http://servername/>) – log in as the local administrator
2. Select Site Settings from the Site Actions menu on the right
3. Select Site features from the Site Administration section
4. Click on the Activate button on the Ezidoesit record
5. Select Create from the Site Actions menu on the right
6. Select Web Part Page from the Web Pages section
7. Enter Ezidoesit as the name
8. Select Full Page, Vertical as the Layout:

New Web Part Page

A Web Part Page is a collection of Web Parts that combines list data, timely information, or useful graphics into a dynamic Web page. The layout and content of a Web Part Page can be set for all users and optionally personalized by each user.

Layout
Select a layout template to arrange Web Parts in zones on the page. Multiple Web Parts can be added to each zone. Specific zones allow Web Parts to be stacked in a horizontal or vertical direction, which is illustrated by differently colored Web Parts. If you do not add a Web Part to a zone, the zone collapses (unless it has a fixed width) and the other zones expand to fill unused space when you browse the Web Part Page.

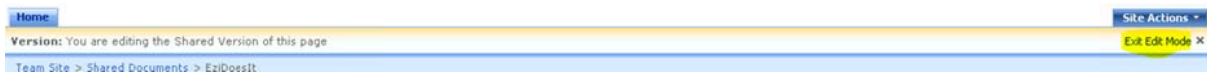
Choose a Layout Template:

- Full Page, Vertical
- Header, Left Column, Body
- Header, Right Column, Body
- Header, Footer, 3 Columns
- Header, Footer, 2 Columns, 4 Rows
- Header, Footer, 4 Columns, Top Row
- Left Column, Header, Footer, Top Row, 3 Columns
- Right Column, Header, Footer, Top Row, 3 Columns

9. Click Create
10. Click on Add Web part
11. Select Ezidoesit Reporting from the All Web Parts list
12. Click on Add

13. On the Right Hand side will be a Properties section where you can set various properties for the web part you have just added.
14. This will have 3 Ezidoesit Properties at the bottom of the list (in the Ezidoesit section). These configure how you are connecting to the Ezidoesit Database and will be the same as the configuration for each of the clients.
 - a. Ezidoesit Server – this is the name of the server where the Ezidoesit Database is installed
 - b. Ezidoesit Database – the name of the Ezidoesit database on the above server
 - c. Windows Authentication – this is a flag to indicate if you are connecting to the database using Windows Authentication or SQL Server Authentication.
If using Windows Authentication then you need to make sure that your Ezidoesit data is on the same server as the SharePoint site or you have configured your server to use Constrained Delegation.
If using SQL Server Authentication then your users will be prompted for their Usernames and Passwords to log into the SQL Server when they try to view the reports.

15. Click on Exit Edit Mod



Add Ezidoesit Page to Top Menu

1. Select Site Settings from the Site Actions menu
2. Click on Top Link Bar
3. Click on New Link
4. Enter the URL to the Ezidoesit page
(<http://servername/Shared%20Documents/Ezidoesit.aspx>)

By default the Ezidoesit web parts expect the Ezidoesit database to be on the default local instance of SQL server.
